

Kindergarten Supply List 2021-2022



Everyone needs:

- ~ 1 **Lightweight backpack** (no wheels or pull handles - it should be large enough to carry folders, lunch box, snack bag & more)
- ~ 1 **Lunch bag or box** (please note, you will send snack daily in a paper bag)
- ~ **5½ x 8½ standard plastic art box** - make sure your child can open and close it independently
- ~ 2 boxes of **Crayola 16 count crayons (regular size, not the large ones)** (no substitutions)
- ~ 1 pack of **Crayola original 8 washable markers** (no substitutions)
- ~ 1 pack of **Crayola 12 pack colored pencils** (no substitutions)
- ~ **Crayola watercolor paint**
- ~ 1 **8 oz. container of Elmer's glue**
- ~ **12 glue sticks** (not the big ones please)
- ~ 1 **pair safety scissors** (right or left handed for your child)
- ~ **12 sharpened #2 pencils**
- ~ 1 **pack of 4 dry erase markers and an eraser**
